

GRAD BLURB INFORMATION

With high school coming to an end, your grad blurb is your chance to thank your friends, family, teachers, or coaches, and anyone else that helped and supported you along the way. Not writing a grad blurb is like leaving without saying goodbye!

CRITERIA:

- Maximum of 350 **characters** (letters, spaces, punctuation marks, numbers count!)
- Any blurb exceeding 350 characters will be adjusted - but try to use all 350 characters available to you.
- This is obvious, but:
 - No language/layout that is inappropriate, offensive, racist, sexist, or trans/homophobic *in any way*.
 - No negative references to staff, administration, other students, or pretty much anyone.
 - No references to illegal activities/substances.

Your blurb can be edited or removed without notice or warning if it doesn't respect the criteria.
