Enrollment: The admission test was completed by grade 5. There are strong 2 groups for 2019-2020. This year we have gone from 111 to 150 in Grade 7.

DLP (Deep Learning) This is inquiry based learning, experiential learning. DLP incorporates inquiry based learning and experiential learning and will be used at all levels An example of this is: One group of students planned / designed the planters which are at the main door and in the cafeteria. Another group built the components, and then another group will assemble them, and yet another will stain them. Following that, another group of students will be determining what types of plants will grow best in that environment as well as other practical experiments. One idea/concept is tackled from different perspectives, meeting different groups' needs as well as providing hands on and different types of learning experiences. Learning is not only done from sitting down in a chair at a desk but rather actively learning.

School Fees: (also discussed during the AGA to parents) Due to the court case results about school fees, the fees that are being charged to parents are reduced and restricted to certain items. There are significantly more stringent criteria for what the school can charge parents and what can be included on the school supply lists. School budgets are now reduced for lab chemicals, food for cooking classes, and other items that used to be covered by school fees. There will have to be some creative thinking for many of the items that used to be covered by school fees.
