IB Report Card and Grades

- Students will be graded in TWO ways.
- 1. According to the IB MYP criterion for each IB Subject
 - a. Language acquisition. (French and Spanish)
 - b. Language and literature. (English)
 - c. Individuals and societies. (Social Studies)
 - d. <u>Sciences</u>.
 - e. <u>Mathematics</u>.
 - f. <u>Arts</u>.
 - g. <u>Physical and health education</u>.
 - h. <u>Design</u>.
- 2. According to the Government of Quebec competencies for each subject.

Students will receive 2 IB report cards per year.

What is Service as Action?

- Becoming involved in
 - school life
 - the community
 - the world
- Taking action when a need is perceived.

Service as Action cont...

- 1. Based on curriculum
 - a. Student initiated
 - i. Learns about a concern, identifies the problem, initiates action
 - b. Teacher initiated
 - i. Teacher points out a concern, class identifies the problem, initiates action.
- 2. Outside of the curriculum
 - a. Student initiated
 - i. Identifies a problem, initiates action
 - b. Teacher/school initiated
 - i. Identifies a problem, initiates action

In all cases, students can work individually as well as in teams.
