







### Use the Library Catalogue to find Books

General Format	Author's Last name, First name. Title of the book. Publisher, Date.
One Author	Davis, F. Hadland. Myths and Legends of India. Orion, 2012.
Two Authors	D'Aulaire, Ingrid, and Edgar Parin d'Aulaire. D'Aulaire's Book of Greek Myths. Bantam Doubleday Dell Publishing, 1962.
Three or More Authors	Gilman, Sandra, et. al. <i>Hysteria Beyond Freud</i> . U of California P, 2013.
Authors with Editors	Dickens, Charles. <i>Oliver Twist</i> . 1838. Edited by Garth Nix, Puffin Classics, 2008.
Print Articles	
Format	If the article/entry is signed, include the author's name; if unsigned, begin with the title of the entry.
Encyclopedias	Sturgeon, Theodore. "Science Fiction." The Encyclopedia Americana.
